

Definition

- Cultural appropriation is the adoption of an element or elements of one culture or identity by members of another culture or identity.
- Cultural appropriation is the unacknowledged or inappropriate adoption of the customs, practices, ideas, etc. of one people or society by members of another and typically more dominant people or society.



Avoiding appropriation

- Consider the context
 - Does it feel respectful or is it promoting stereotypes?
 - Does the culture have a history of discrimination?
 - What is the cultural significance of this practice or item?
- Explore your motivations
 - Are you exploring a culture or following a trend?
 - Will you benefit in some way?
- Give credit
- Support businesses run by people from that culture
